YOUR NEW SESSION CLERK

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Ross Andrews and I'm the new Session Clerk, having officially taken over from Donald Muir from the 1st July. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Donald for all the effort that he has put in during his time as Session Clerk, especially over the past year or so with the vacancy and then the union with Drumoak & Durris. I'm particularly grateful to Donald for his detailed handover and also for the fact that he will be continuing to support both myself and Fiona as we get up to speed with the roles of Session Clerk and Deputy Session Clerk respectively.

If you've ever spoken with me, it will be obvious that I'm not a local Culter loon! I grew up in rural Northern Ireland on my parents' farm, coming to Scotland in 1992 to go to Edinburgh University and then moving to Aberdeen for work when I graduated. I moved to Culter in 2014. Throughout all these moves I've still managed to keep (most) of my accent. Hopefully you're able to understand what I'm saying.



My church journey started at my local church in Northern Ireland, Killeter Presbyterian Church. As a student in Edinburgh I usually attended the

nearest Church of Scotland to my accommodation. When I came to Aberdeen I joined the Kirk of St. Nicholas Uniting, becoming an elder in 2009 and latterly joint Session Clerk. The congregation was dissolved at the end of 2020, after which I joined Culter Kirk. My first experience of worshipping at Culter Kirk was in 2014. My daughter had joined the Brownies and she took part in the Remembrance Sunday parade. I went along to support her. I have to admit I was a bit apprehensive at first, coming to an unfamiliar Church where everybody knew everybody else and I would feel an outsider. During the service John Ferguson highlighted a book that had recently been published to commemorate the start of the First World War, which detailed those people from Culter who had died in the war. At that service he read out the details of those who had died in 2014. What struck me at the time was the fact that most, if not all, of those people were born elsewhere and had moved to Culter for work, much like myself. That fact, combined with the welcome I received completely allayed any misgivings I had. Since then I've always felt at ease here and I hope that everyone who comes through our doors feel just as warmly welcomed and made to feel as home as I was then.
